STAFFING IN UN-HABITAT AS AT 31 OCTOBER 2016

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The report describes the staffing situation at UN-Habitat for the first ten months of the year 2016 as at 31 October 2016.

A. Professional Posts

1. Regular Budget

There are 50 established professional posts under the Regular Budget for the biennium 2016–2017, 41 posts or 82 per cent were occupied as at 31 October 2016, with 9 posts or 18 per cent at various stages of recruitment.

2. Extra-budgetary Resources

a) Habitat and Human Settlements Foundation (General Purpose)

There are 80 Foundation General Purpose professional posts, of which 32 posts or 40 per cent were occupied as at 31 October 2016, and one post or 1.3 per cent under recruitment. UN-Habitat continues to take a cautious approach to new recruitments, taking into account the availability of funds.

b) Foundation Programme Support

There were 5 active Foundation programme support posts, with 2 post under recruitment as at 31 October 2016.

c) Technical Cooperation Programme Support

There were 25 active technical cooperation programme support posts, 22 posts or 88 per cent were occupied with 3 posts or 12 per cent under recruitment as at 31 October 2016.

d) Habitat Programme Managers (HPMs)

As at 31 October 2016, 11 countries were supported by Habitat Programme Managers.

3. Junior Professional Officers (JPOs)

As at 31 October 2016, there were 9 JPOs working in UN-Habitat, 6 JPOs or 66.7 per cent based in Nairobi, and 3 JPOs or 33.3 per cent out posted at the following locations: the UN-Habitat Liaison Office in Brussels and the Regional Office for Arab States in Cairo.

4. Total professional staff at UN-Habitat

Annex I provides a summary of approved and occupied professional (international and national) posts in UN-Habitat by source of funding. As at 31 October 2016 there were a total of 227 active professional posts of which 207 or 91.2 per cent were occupied, giving an overall vacancy rate of 8.8 per cent.

Annex III shows the professional staff by nationality, grade and gender.

Annex IV provides a summary of distribution of all professional (international and national) staff by duty station and gender.

B. General Services Posts

5. General Service Posts

As at 31 October 2016, there were a total of 120 active General Services and related posts, of which 109 posts or 90.8 per cent were occupied. The overall vacancy rate was 9.2 per cent.

Annex IV provides a summary of distribution of all General Services and related staff by duty station and gender.
