Get to Know Abjad!

In the heart of Tabbaneh and on the demarcation line between Tabbaneh and Jabal Mohsen, ABJAD, the socio-cultural center was found, to be a safe place for all the residents.

ABJAD works under the mission of targeting women, youth, and children to improve their lives quality, through life skills, vocational training, and activities that engage them in cultural and prevention programs based on human security principles.







ABJAD center is known as the first communal center in Tabbaneh. The residents in the surrounding neighborhoods benefit from a variety of activities that are offered either by ABJAD's team or external experts and partners. It is a space and sanctuary for citizens seeking protection-related support and personal development. It is a nest that fosters activities that improve human security through personal and economic empowerment for both the host and refugee communities.

Thanks to the combined efforts between **UTOPIA Organization** from one side, the three **UN** agencies _ **UN-HABITAT**, **UNICEF**, and **UN Women**, and the **Municipality of Tripoli**, ABJAD was created in Tabbaneh. The launching event took place on **August 1st, 2018**.



Since then, more than **5,000 individuals** from all genders, ages, nationalities, and backgrounds from Tabbaneh and its surroundings have visited ABJAD and benefitted from the programs running in it.

ABJAD is the one of a kind socio-cultural center in Tabbaneh that combines in one place a variety of facilities including

Needs Matter



Tripoli is the central urban city of the North, inhabited by about 0.5 million, including 64K Syrian Refugees, and others (PRL and stateless). Almost half of the Tripolitans live below the poverty line.

Most of Tripoli neighborhoods are crowded, especially the vulnerable areas. The social tension between refugees and host communities exists widely in Tripoli, especially in a vulnerable area like Tabbaneh.

In a vulnerable context like the one in Tripoli, the need is varied and is greatly increasing on different levels.

Thusly, Abjad's first priority is to empower the individuals and addressing their most basic needs by offering them social and economic opportunities and capacity building, in the way to community development and growth.

Every Activity is a Step Toward HUMAN SECURITY

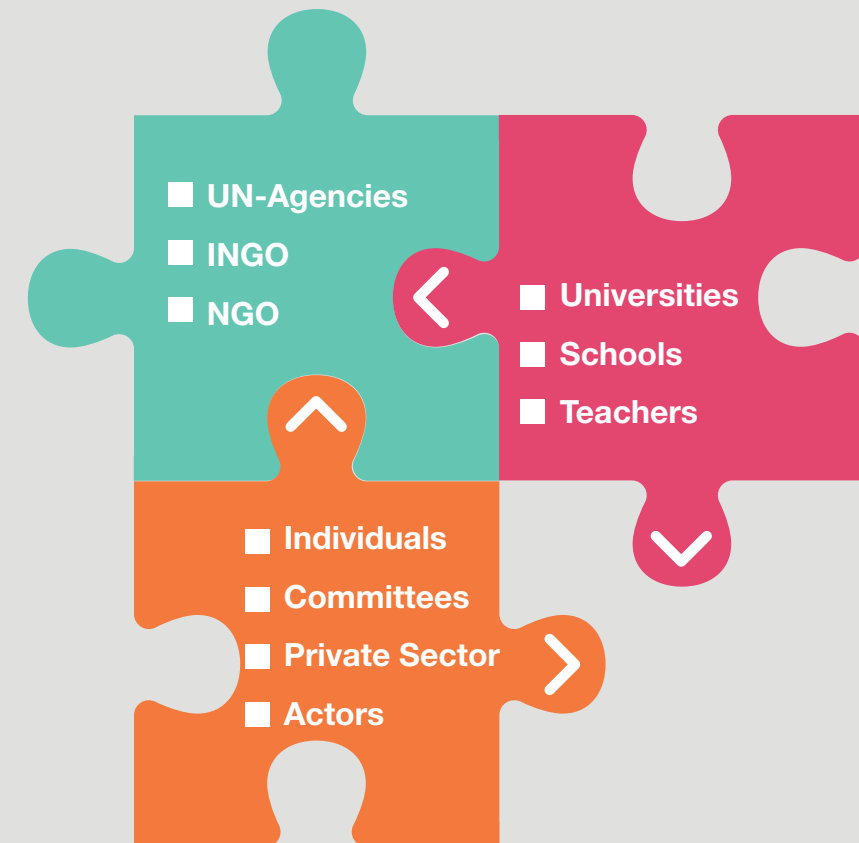

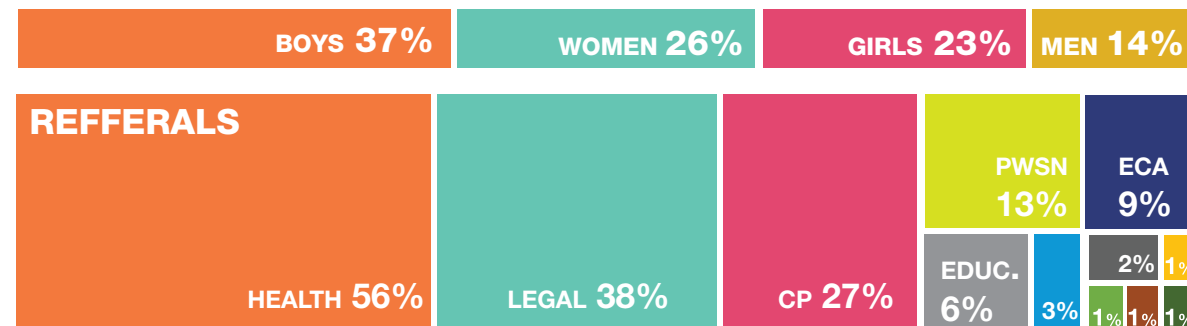
The Holistic Approach is the Way



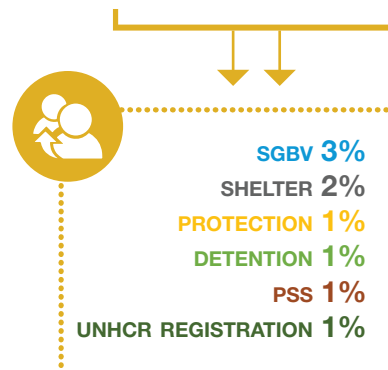
In ABJAD, we aim through our holistic approach to ensure integration of services, for a better benefit of women, men, youth, and children of the social opportunities that are available for them in their community. The protection desk in ABJAD center which is operating 5 days a week, receives beneficiaries from all backgrounds, and answer their questions regarding their needs and services. Through the protection desk, people receive a hearing ear for their thoughts and an answer for their concerns. They find a service mapping available for them to know more about the protection and other services available for them in their community. They also get the chance to benefit from the referral and the legal consultation services available for them on our protection desk.

Referrals: The protection desk in ABJAD Center receives community members requesting a specific service, **159 cases** were referred during 2019 to service providers, with **more than 40% of the referrals were marked successfully closed.**

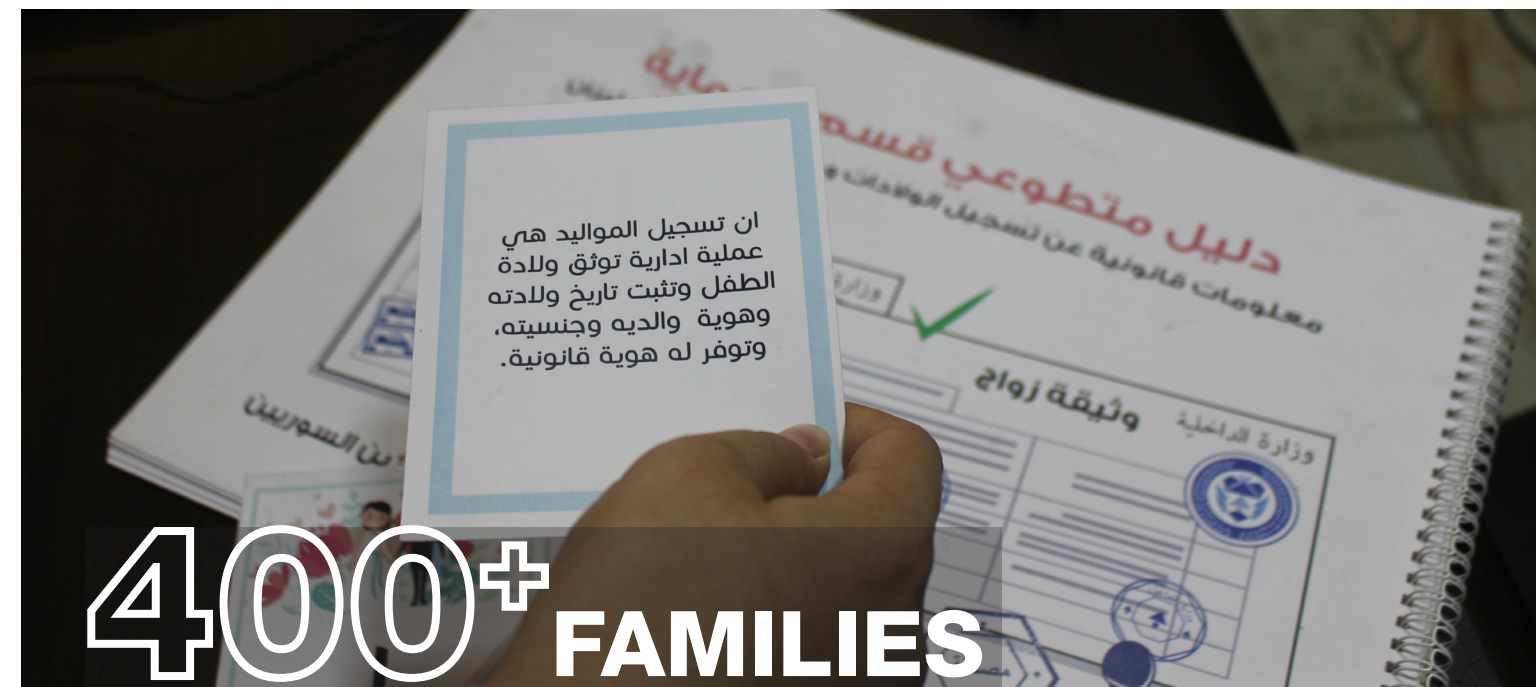
The beneficiaries of referrals are 23% girls, 37% boys, 26% women, and 14% men.



The main referrals are for the services of Health, Legal assistance (birth and marriage registration, ID confiscation), Child protection, in addition to many different sectors, as shown in the graph above.



Legal Consultations: In 2019, ABJAD the socio-cultural Center in Tabbaneh, fostered a legal protection unit, which helped more than 150 families in registering newborns and certifying new marriages. The main objective of this unit was to strengthen the protection status of Syrian refugees and the host community from Tripoli, especially children and women. While statelessness is a real protection issue in the unprivileged neighborhoods in Tripoli, such as Tabbaneh and surroundings, UTOPIA through the Legal Unit in ABJAD Center, helped in preventing statelessness by offering specialized protection and legal services to vulnerable families including legal counseling and legal representation, to certify marriages and register newborns. The factors that made a successful intervention out of the legal unit, are not only the specialized team but also the advantages of ABJAD center which allowed wide access to the service by offering a safe space for the legal unit, especially for women and children, in a central location reachable to the persons of concern from many neighborhoods in need. Eventually, 125 vulnerable families were assisted to register newborns to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs level, 30 families were assisted to obtain marriage certificates, 6 families were assisted in legal representation cases for statelessness, and more than 400 families were assisted with legal counseling on multiple topics in ABJAD center.

The Story of Yazan



Yazan's nightmares now are gone ...
He will be able to move on.

"I started to lose hope with the situation of my little one Yazan. He was not OK. He used to scream while sleeping because of his nightmares of the bombs and explosions. The war was too much for him to forget". That's how Mrs. "D" described her son's situation before one of her friends invited her to attend one of the awareness sessions in ABJAD. "I was hopelessly doing my best as a widowed mother to ease his fear" she added.

Mrs. "D" attended a session about how to access available services for refugees in Tripoli. Where she knew that there are indeed NGOs that are offering their services to support refugees, and that she can always access ABJAD to benefit from the valuable activities that are tailored to meet the needs of refugees generally, and women particularly.

"Not only my son got referred by ABJAD referrals desk to a mental health agency to support him, but also myself. After a year of support, Yazan's nightmares now are gone, and I am pretty sure that he will be able to move on" she said.

The Story of Huda

Huda is another example, In ABJAD center Huda got the opportunity to participate in a series of psycho-social support through ART sessions. She was one of a group of 13 ladies, coming from different backgrounds and nationalities.

It wasn't easy for her to accept this at the beginning, however, the workshops were very attractive and relevant, this is what she felt from the very first session, and what made her excited to continue all the sessions and workshops. According to Huda, these workshops made her experience new techniques of stress and tension release and made her feel like a little girl again. The most beautiful part of this was that she was exploring herself, as well as the participants, and they were interacting with each other as humans, regardless of all the differences between them.

"I made new friends. Every time I feel stressed out now, I go to meet them and have some good time together. We meet in ABJAD actually, too often. I even learned how to deal with my own stress. This helped a lot in improving my communication with my family. This changed my life."

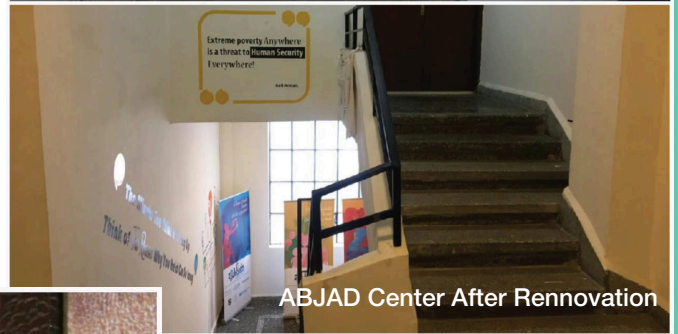
