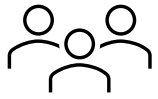

UN Task Force on Future of Cities in support of the UN reforms

Secretary-General requested Executive Director of UN-Habitat identify mechanisms to **engage cities in intergovernmental and national planning processes**, convening 20 UN entities and the Global Task Force on Local and Regional Governments.

USG Turk, UNDP Administrator Steiner, and Executive Director agree to utilize UN Task Force to prepare draft **terms of reference for SG Advisory Group on Local and Regional Governments**.

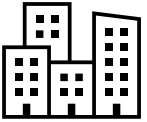


UN reforms on peace and security

UN-Habitat strengthening the development-humanitarian-peace nexus:

- Implementing the SG Executive Committee **Action Plan on Land and Conflict** & the EC **Action Plan on Internal Displacement**.
- Providing **technical expertise on inclusive urban planning** to build social cohesion and provide durable solution, constituting 60% of UN-Habitat project portfolio.

| CONCLUDING MESSAGES : EXPECTATIONS AND PROPOSED OUTOMES

OPERATIONAL GOAL : To work in countries where we have a field presence and can leverage projects to develop programs, but also in countries where we don't have a field presence and have strong demand within the country and from the UN Resident Coordinators.

IMPLEMENTATION MODELS: Field Test effective implementation models (with UNDCO) in order to develop guidance notes for UN Resident Coordinators, and then replicate and scale up.

FUNDING: Call on donor governments that currently fund UN-Habitat to work on this initiative so that together we can demonstrate our new business model. This may encourage other donor governments to support our work.
