## UN-Habitat on housing and the upcoming World Urban Forum

**Nairobi, Kenya, 14 February 2024** — The United Nations Human Settlements Programme (UN-Habitat) – the United Nations entity responsible for sustainable urban development – is pleased to invite editors and reporters based in Nairobi to a media briefing on 22 February at the UN complex in Gigiri.

The briefing will cover the following topics:

- Progress in the implementation of the key resolutions from the second session of the United Nations Habitat Assembly, held in Nairobi, Kenya, from 5 to 9 June 2023: housing, people-centered smart cities, transformation of informal settlements and biodiversity;
- Theme and the logo of the twelfth session of the World Urban Forum (WUF12), to be held in Cairo, Egypt, from 4 to 8 November 2024;
- UN-Habitat's new strategic plan for the period 2026-2029.

The second United Nations Habitat Assembly, which took place in June 2023 in Nairobi, Kenya, adopted a historical resolution on affordable housing for all. Member States agreed to renew their call to prioritize adequate housing and view housing as a human right for the first time since 1948, when the Universal Declaration of Human Rights was adopted. The Assembly also adopted a resolution with a mandate to develop international guidelines for people-centred smart cities, accelerate transformation of informal settlements by 2030 and preserve biodiversity in cities.

The twelfth session of the World Urban Forum (WUF12) will be co-organized with the Government of Egypt. The forum will return to Africa for the first time since 2001. It will be held in Cairo from 4 to 8 November 2024.

UN-Habitat has started work on developing its new strategic plan that will set priorities for sustainable urban development from 2026 to 2029. Its current plan will expire in 2025. It focuses on impact in four broad areas: reduce spatial inequality and poverty, enhance shared prosperity for cities and regions, strengthen climate action and improve urban environment, and provide effective urban crisis prevention and response.
