



### UN-Habitat's Input to the Pact for the Future

**Chapeau:** The Pact for the Future must recognize that the future of the world is urban. Implementing the New Urban Agenda is key for localizing the SDGs and other global agendas.

#### b. World Social Summit, 2025

The Secretary General recommended the convening of the World Social Summit in 2025 to cover issues such as universal social protection, including universal health coverage, adequate housing, education for all and decent work, and give momentum towards achieving the Sustainable Development Goals



The **right to adequate** housing is a key entry point for UN-Habitat. The open-ended intergovernmental expert working group, established by UNHA2 resolution HSP/HA.2/Res.7 on Adequate Housing for All, currently considers policy recommendations for accelerating progress towards the universal achievement of safe, sustainable, adequate and affordable housing.



UN-Habitat is updating its normative guidelines and mobilizes a multi-stakeholder partnership to reinvigorate the attainment of adequate housing for all.

An ECOSOC special meeting on the topic could help to build further momentum.
